

Bernadette Black is a Member of the Order of Australia for her significant service to young people, communities, and local government. A successful leader in human centered policy, she has learned that transforming communities must be based on three pillars; lived expertise, collaboration, and primary prevention. As founder and CEO of the Brave Foundation, over the past 16 years, Bernadette has gained a deep understanding of the issues facing our most disadvantaged young people. Many of them pinball between various government functions that only see a part, not the whole, person. She believes these silos of support and funding can enable longterm welfare dependency at a systemic level and that local governments can play a vital role in turning this around.

Australian Olympic Swimming Champion

Dr Shane Gould AM MBE is an Australian sporting legend with a doctorate in the Culture of Swimming in Australia. She developed problem solving skills to apply to her sport of swimming - how to improve, resetting goals after setbacks and maintaining a positive public profile for 50 years. Shane also immersed herself during the last 10 years, studying at UTAS and Victoria University to conduct research into the culture of swimming in Australia and the causes of the tragedy of people drowning. In 2018, Shane became the oldest person to ever win the TV series, Australian Survivor. She spends time on video chats with her four children and six grandchildren, is a keen horsewoman, Bicheno ocean swimmer, property developer, and enjoys a yarn over a good cup of coffee.
